Wednesday June 16th CBT Conceptualization and Interventions

This workshop will describe the CBT model, identify key characteristics of this approach and provide a detailed account of how to formulate case conceptualizations from a CBT perspective, as well as an overview of effective interventions

Wednesday Sept. 22nd CBT with Personality disorders

This workshop will provide a cognitive model of personality disorder. Specific personality disorders will be conceptualized from a cognitive perspective and cognitive behavioral interventions will be described for each with particular attention being given to the cognitive-behavioral treatment of borderline personality disorder.

Thursday June 17th CBT For Mood Disorders

This workshop will describe the cognitive model of mood disturbance and outline CBT Interventions for major depression, bipolar disorder, chronic depression and depression in children.

Thursday Sept 23rd CBT for substance misuse/abuse

This workshop will outline a cognitive behavioral model of substance abuse/misuse and demonstrate in some detail cognitive and behavioral strategies for these problems. The workshop will also focus on relapse prevention and on CBT approaches to assisted medication (benzodiazepine and narcotic) withdrawal.

Friday June 18th CBT For Anxiety Disorders

This workshop will outline a cognitive model of anxiety and specific models related to discrete anxiety disorders such as GAD, Panic Disorder and OCD. CBT interventions for these disorders will be described and demonstrated. Adaptations for treating anxious children will also be outlined.

Friday Sept 2th CBT with Children and Adolescents

This workshop will outline general adaptations in CBT practice for working with children and adolescents, provide a description of cognitive behavioral conceptualization and interventions with depressed and anxious children and also focus on using CBT with behavioral problems presenting in children and adolescents with Conduct Disorder, Oppositional Defiant Disorder and ADHD.

TRAINERS

Trent Codd, Ed.S., is President of the CBT Center of WNC, PA, a licensed professional counselor, licensed clinical addictions specialist and an experienced psychotherapist, who treats anxiety, mood, personality and substance use disorders with CBT. He has completed training at the Beck Institute for Cognitive Therapy and Research and in Acceptance and Commitment Therapy with Steve C. Hayes & Colleagues. He is a Certified Affiliate of the Academy of Cognitive Therapy and has provided training in CBT for many years locally and nationally.

John Ludgate, PhD is a licensed clinical psychologist, who has worked as a psychotherapist for almost 30 years. He specializes in treating mood, anxiety, and psychosexual disorders. He trained at the Center for Cognitive Therapy under Dr. Aaron Beck, the founder of Cognitive Therapy, obtaining a Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Cognitive Therapy from the University of Pennsylvania in 1986. He subsequently became Assistant Director of Training at Dr. Beck's Center. In the early 1990's, Dr. Ludgate was a Research Clinical Psychologist at the University of Oxford in England and served as cognitive therapist in several outcome studies of panic disorder, agoraphobia, social phobia and hypochondriasis.
